When driving on wet roads, try to drive in the tire prints of the car ahead of you. When a car hydroplanes, it's riding on a thin layer of water between the tires and the road. The water in tire prints has already been displaced, so you get better traction. If your car does begin to hydroplane, hold the steering wheel steady and lightly apply brakes. When you feel the tires touch the pavement, slow down until regaining control.
